MIX ALL YOUR RECYCLABLES TOGETHER

Here's How It Works

NOW ALL RECYCLABLE ITEMS MIX TOGETHER IN ONE BIN FOR COLLECTION.

- ➔ All recyclable items—paper, plastic, metal, and glass—need to be mixed together loosely in one identifiable container marked with a sticker.
- ➔ Recyclables must be placed in your designated recycling bin or a durable plastic or metal lidded container of your choice, under 32 gallons and not more than 20 pounds.
- ➔ Do not place recyclables in plastic bags for collection. No string, no trash or green waste.

*Lids must be removed from all containers before recycling.

PAPER

- ➔ Newspaper & Inserts
- ➔ Junk Mail & Circulars
- ➔ Magazines & Catalogs
- ➔ Phone & Paperback Books
- ➔ Brown Grocery Bags
- ➔ Lightweight & Corrugated Cardboard

NO: Hard Cover Books, Napkins, Paper Plates, Tissue Paper, Soda & Beer Cartons or Construction Paper

PLASTIC

- ➔ Containers with Codes 1-5 & 7



- ➔ Beverage Cartons (milk, water, juice & juice boxes)
- ➔ Windshield Washer Jugs
- ➔ Detergent Containers

NO: Plastic Bags, Medicine Bottles, Styrofoam, Toys or Motor Oil Bottles

METAL

- ➔ Food & Beverage Cans
- ➔ Deposit Cans
- ➔ Aluminum Foil
- ➔ Aluminum Plates & Trays
- ➔ Aerosol Cans
- ➔ Metal Lids

NO: Metal-Cardboard Containers (Cocoa & Motor Oil), Silverware or Small Appliances

GLASS

- ➔ Green, Amber & Clear Containers
- ➔ Canning Jars
- ➔ Deposit Bottles
- ➔ Liquor & Wine Bottles
- ➔ Food & Beverage Containers

NO: Broken Glass, Drinking Glasses, Ovenware, Ceramics, Dishes, Mirrors, Window Glass or Light Bulbs



Items That Should Not Be Placed in Your Recycling Bin

| <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➔ Sharps
Do not set out with your recyclables! Place used needles, syringes and lancets in a puncture-proof plastic container like a laundry detergent bottle with a top. 1 Exception to the Rule!

Collection & Disposal Information

GARBAGE & RECYCLING SET-OUT REQUIREMENTS



All garbage shall be placed in tightly covered, watertight, galvanized iron, non-rusting metal or plastic containers with handles.

CONTAINERS →

- Shall have a capacity of no less than 10 gallons and no more than 32 gallons per container.
- Garbage shall not weigh more than 40 pounds.
- Recyclables shall not weigh more than 20 pounds.
- Place garbage & recycling out no earlier than 6:00 pm on the evening before pickup.
- When there is snow, place all garbage & recyclables at the edge of your driveway between the sidewalk & road.

FLUORESCENT LIGHT BULBS AND BATTERIES →

Compact fluorescent light bulbs and flashlight type batteries including recyclable styles cannot be placed at the curb for collection under the City program. These light bulbs contain mercury and batteries contain heavy metals and other harmful elements and should be disposed of in an environmentally safe manner. Residents should handle bulbs and batteries safely and dispose of them by delivering them to City Hall, 377 Sherrill Road.



GREEN WASTE →

Residents should place leaves, grass, twigs and other green waste in a reusable plastic or metal container not to exceed 32 gallons, and under 40 pounds. Please do not bag leaves and green waste. Leaves and grass clippings may be left in loose piles in the marginal strip (the space between the sidewalk and road). We do not accept rocks or soil. Shrubbery, branches and limbs should be placed parallel to the road and should be no longer than six (6) feet and no wider than twelve (12) inches. There is a limit of one dump truck load per collection. Green waste is picked up Spring-Fall and may be brought to the DPW garage and placed in designated areas. Compost is available adjacent to the Waste Water Treatment Plant, 201 Fairway Lane.
