Assessor News

Enhanced STAR- Individuals who will be turning 65 in 2016 who are not currently receiving the Enhanced STAR school property tax exemption are considered 65 for the exemption on January 1, 2016 regardless of when your birthday is in 2016. Property owners currently receiving the Enhanced STAR school property tax exemption who are not signed up for automatic renewal- it is time to renew your exemption! The 2016 Enhanced STAR combined income is \$84,550 based on your 2014 income. Income is defined as "adjusted gross income" (AGI) for federal income tax purposes as reported on the applicants' federal or State income tax return for the applicable income tax year, less the "taxable amount" of total distributions from IRAs. Those applying for a new or renewed Enhanced STAR exemption may elect to participate in a voluntary program whereby the Assessor's office is automatically notified in future years by the State regarding the income eligibility of the applicant(s). automatic process is only useful for those filing New York State income tax returns. Applications for the "Income Verification Program" are available at the Assessor's office. This automatic process cannot be used for any other income-related exemption application such as and including the Senior Citizen's exemption application.

Basic STAR- For those not receiving the Basic STAR property tax exemption for their primary residence, this exemption is not age limited and the income level is \$500,000. **Basic STAR requires an initial application only.** If you have recently purchased a residence in Sherrill or have not previously applied you may qualify for this significant property tax exemption to lower your school tax bill.

All exemption applications must be submitted to the Assessor for processing prior to March 1, 2016. Please contact City Assessor Bob Comis at 264-6362 with questions. Bob will schedule times at City Hall to process your Enhanced STAR form. Those applying for BASIC STAR can bring a completed application to City Hall or meet with Bob during the dates he will be at City Hall. Those dates and time will be will be posted on the City's website and listed in an upcoming newsletter.



Additionally, garbage pick-up in the Village of Vernon changes from Thursday November 26 to Tuesday November 24 and Thursday December 24 to Tuesday December 22.

Brush and Green Waste Pick Up- September 21, October 5, and October 19. After October 19 all brush must be taken to the City's transfer station at no charge. Please place brush and green waste at the curb the weekend before Monday's pick up. Brush must be no longer than six feet and no wider than four inches, and separated from green waste. Soil and rocks aren't accepted. *Please do not bag brush or green waste.

Leaves- The City will pick up leaves as the weather dictates. Please rake leaves to the curb. Please do not put branches, sticks or twigs with leaves because they are used for composting.

Transfer Station- The transfer station will be open Wednesdays 3:30-5:30pm and Saturdays 8am-1pm until October 31. Beginning November 1 it will be open only on Saturdays until spring. Residents must purchase coupons at City Hall to drop off items.

Police Department Reminders

- -The "No Parking" on city streets ordinance resumes November 1-April 30. This ordinance applies to all streets between 2-7am.
- -Studded tires are allowed October 15-May 1.
- -School is back in session! Drivers should stop for all stopped school buses, as well as be aware of children crossing the roads.
- -Please remember to pick up after your dogs.
