From the Fire Department....

Our next chicken barbeque will be on fireworks day, July 25th.

Join us and leave the cooking to us!

On the topic of grilling- 3 out of 5 households own gas grills, which means many tasty meals but also increased risk of fires. Each year an average of 8,800 home fires are caused by grilling. While nearly half of people grill year-round, July is the peak month for grill fires.

Grilling by the numbers:

- In 2012, 16,900 patients went to ERs due to injuries involving grills.
- 1 in 6 home fires involving grills were due to a flammable item being too close to the grill.
- Leaks or breaks were factors in 1 in 5 grill fires.
- Gas grills contribute to a higher number of home fires overall than their charcoal counterparts.

It's also Thunderstorm Season!

Thunderstorm Season Safety Tips:

- Severe Thunderstorm Watches* are issued when severe storms are possible to alert you that damaging winds and hail may develop.
- Severe Thunderstorm Warnings* are issued when a storm has been spotted and is going to move through the area soon. Remain CALM, but take action IMMEDIATELY to protect lives and property.
- Be Prepared-* Have a kit which includes a flashlight, battery-operated radio, first aid kit and manual, non-electric can opener, extra batteries, emergency food and water, medicines, cash, and credit cards.
- Before the Storm-* Check the forecast, watch for signs of storms, delay outdoor activities if storms are imminent, and check on neighbors who require assistance: infants, the elderly, and people with disabilities.
- During the Storm-* If you can hear thunder, you're close enough to the storm to be struck by lightning. Move to a sturdy building or car. DO NOT take shelter in small sheds, under isolated trees, or in convertible automobiles. Get out of boats and away from water. Telephone lines and metal pipes can conduct electricity so avoid using phones and don't take baths or showers. Unplug unnecessary appliances and turn off air conditioners as power surges from lightning can overload compressors. Get to higher ground if flooding is possible. DO NOT attempt to drive to safety- most flash flooding deaths occur in cars. If you're caught outdoors and no shelter is nearby find a low spot away from trees, fences, and poles. If you're in the woods, take shelter under shorter trees. If you feel your skin tingle or your hair stand on end, squat low to the ground on the balls of your feet. Place your hands on your knees with your head between them. Make yourself the smallest target possible and minimize contact with the ground.
- After the Storm-* Check on neighbors who may require special assistance, avoid all downed power lines- assume they are live electricity, and continue to monitor NOAA Weather Radio and your local media for latest weather updates.

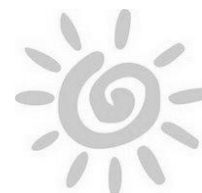
